SUMMER 1 HIGHTLIGHTS ABERSOCH



We kicked off the term with paddle boarding sessions, where students not only learned new skills but also enjoyed the beautiful weather and teamwork.


On the hill, our creative land art project allowed students to express their artistic talents while connecting with nature.




Look what we've learnt!
