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# AUTUMN 2 HIGHLIGHTS POLZEATH

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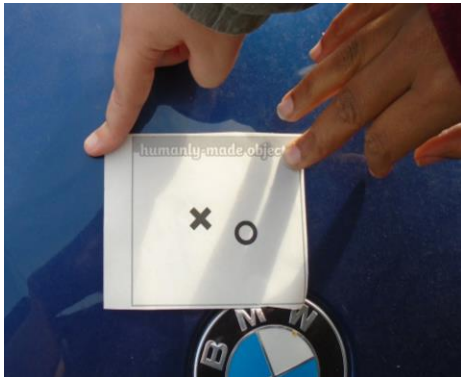
## What an Awesome Journey!

## **Out-of-School Adventures**

This term has been packed with opportunities for students to explore and grow beyond the classroom. From swimming sessions that boosted confidence in the water, to PE activities that kept everyone active and energized, we've seen fantastic progress.

Every Monday afternoon we often embrace the cold weather to do a Duke of Edinburgh (DOE) also called Junior Award Scheme (JAS) activity, usually involving a walk up the St Catherine's Hill, taking spectacular shots of nature scenes or leaves and more. This has promoted teambuilding while learning new skills alongside.

## Employment and Development

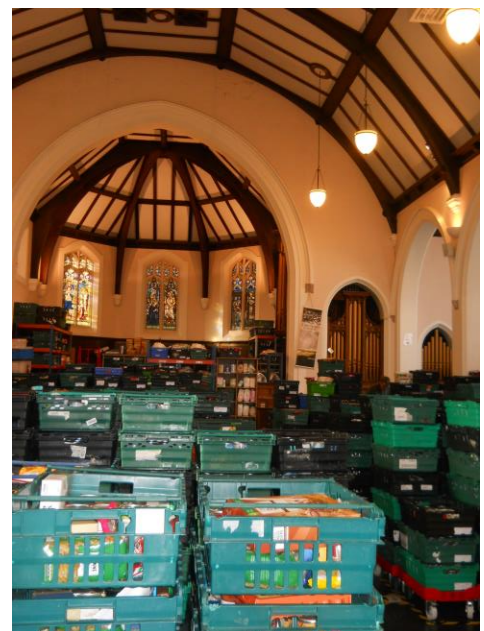
As part of their Employment and Development course, Year 10 and 11 students were invited to go and visit a local community initiative.

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Our learners embraced the sustainability challenge set by Melrose, with creativity, energy, and a huge amount of hard work, transforming recycled materials into a colourful festive wonderland!

Giant candy canes were crafted from old upholstery cardboard tubes, brought to life with layers of carefully applied papier-mâché. They added cheerful bows and gift tags made from fabric and card supplied by the Dorset Scrap Project, giving each candy cane its own personality.

The fun continued as learners upcycled cardboard boxes, designing vibrant wrapping paper using stamps, paint, pens, and collage inspired by the things they love. These boxes were then stacked into a huge, eye-catching mountain of presents that set the perfect scene for the candy canes. This project was created to help learners experience the excitement of working together on a big collaborative piece, seeing how their individual ideas and their hard work could combine into one amazing display. 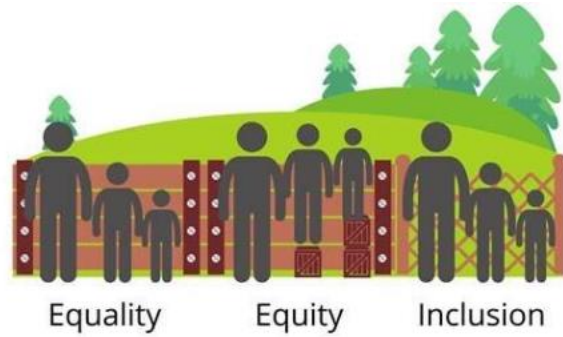
